

## PROJECT DETAILS

In late 2015, The City of Bowling Green contracted with *The Shelly Company* to perform the **2015 Paving Program**. Now that Spring has arrived the project is about to begin.

The project will involve milling of the old asphalt pavement followed by paving the new course of asphalt. Some concrete work will be performed in various locations on sidewalks and curb replacements.

### Start dates:

*Week of April 11, 2016 (concrete work begins)*

*April 16, 2016 (milling pavement begins)*

*Week of April 18, 2016 (paving begins)*

### Completion date:

*July 31, 2016 by contract.* But the project is expected to last roughly 2 to 4 weeks, ending in early May; weather and other delays may extend the work.

## DRIVEWAY & BUSINESS ACCESS

The Contractor is obligated to maintain access to driveways and businesses within the construction zone.

Certain operations, such as excavation or the installation of asphalt directly in front of your home or business, may cause a temporary delay.

If you know that you will need vehicle access, call Public Works at (419) 354-6227 and ask that the Project Inspector be notified. If you are returning to your home/business and encounter work that blocks your access, the workers should be able to assist you.

Some intersections within the project may need to be closed at times for construction.

Only those who live/work within the construction zone will be permitted access to these areas.

**ROAD CLOSED TO THRU TRAFFIC** and **ROAD WORK AHEAD** signs will be posted accordingly. Traffic may also be reduced to one-lane at times.

If the road is completely barricaded with a **ROAD CLOSED** sign, you are **NOT allowed** to drive past the barricades.

If you have doubts or questions, please stop and ask!

## TRASH & RECYCLING COLLECTION

City provided refuse and recycling collection will continue on your regular day.

However, to aid in the construction, those containers will be picked up first.

So please have the containers out by **6:30 am** for collection during the project.



## LANDSCAPING & IRRIGATION

If any irrigation/sprinkler systems exist within the right of way or near the construction area, it is recommended that the property owner make arrangements to have them marked by a flag so they are visible to the contractor.

The responsibility for repair of your irrigation system and landscaping located in the City right of way, is the property owners.
