ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADOPTING SECTION 33.03(A) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN, OHIO, RELATING TO PAY FOR SCHOOL POLICE, INTERNS, AND CIVIL INFRACTIONS HEARING OFFICER

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN, WOOD COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1: That Section 33.03(A) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Bowling Green, Ohio, is hereby adopted to read as follows:

SECTION 33.03 PAY SCALE ESTABLISHED FOR SCHOOL POLICE AND INTERNS, AND CIVIL INFRACTIONS HEARING OFFICER

- (A) School Police. (1) \$13.40 for a morning crossing (start of school day) worked. (2) \$13.40 for mid-day crossing worked (employees who cover mid-day crossings will be paid a maximum of \$13.40 regardless whether they cross children only at the end of the morning kindergarten session only at the start of the afternoon kindergarten session, or are required to cover both mid-day time periods). (3) \$13.40 for afternoon crossing (end of school day) worked.

Employees working as School Police shall in no case be paid more than \$40.20 per day.

The crossing rates established above for School Police shall be effective August 1, 2022.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN INNOVATIVE TECHNOLOGY PARK TO BOWLING GREEN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN LIEU OF DUES TO FACILITATE A DEVELOPMENT PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN, COUNTY OF WOOD, AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute a deed for the properties known as Inlot Numbers 7320 and 7321 in Innovative Technology Park, Plat 1, in the City of Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio, to Bowling Green Economic Development, formerly known as The Bowling Green Community Development Foundation, in lieu of dues, to facilitate an economic development project that will enhance the city and create numerous jobs for our citizens.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect as an emergency measure. The reason for the emergency is a prompt effectiveness of this measure is necessary in order to facilitate the economic development project that will enhance the Innovative Technology Park owned by the City, and will enhance the City in general by providing jobs for our citizens, and, in order to meet time lines established by the proposed end user, this ordinance must take effect at the earliest time possible, so as to protect the public health, safety, and well-being of our citizens.
