# Bur Oak

- 135 Ada Street
- Circumference - 16.3 Feet
- Height – 83 Feet
- Located in the rear of this property. This oak with its massive trunk could have largest-widest canopy of any City tree.



# Austrian Pines

- 1001 Napoleon Road
- Circumference – 7.7 Feet
- Height – 57 Feet
- Circumference – 7.6
- Height – 52 Feet
- Located in the front yard of this very old field stone house are two pines.



# Dawn Redwood

- 808 Cherry Hill Drive
- Circumference – 5.5 Feet
- Height – 72 Feet
- Located in the front yard this unusual tree was planted in 1968 by Ted Groat when he resided at the residence.



# American Elm

- 1314 Napoleon Road
- Circumference – 14.6 Feet
- Height – 87 Feet
- Located just east of Cherry Hill Drive on the south side of Napoleon Road. This planted in the right place away from power lines has a magnificent canopy.



# Black Maple

- 724 Ordway Avenue
- Circumference – 7 Feet
- Height – 72 Feet
- Located on the east side of this home. This unusual specimen has a very symmetrical shape.
- A subspecies of Sugar Maple. The difference is fine hairs on bottom of the leaf.



# White Oak

- 420 Knollwood Avenue
- Circumference – 10.4 Feet
- Height – 125 Feet
- Located in the rear yard there is a small grove of oaks on the sloping hill. This area once a golf course before being developed into home sites.



# Holly

- 10 Parkwood Drive
- Circumference – 3.5 Feet
- Height – 35 Feet
- Located in the side-rear yard this specimen is really a shrub but has been shaped into tree form and size.



# Green Ash

- 841 Scott Blvd.
- Circumference – 9.5 Feet
- Height – 92 Feet
- Located in rear yard away  
planted in the right place  
away from overhead lines  
has a massive canopy.



# Red Oak

- 881 Scott Blvd.
- Circumference – 15 Feet
- Height – 121 Feet
- Located across the street from 156 Brigham Lane there is small grove of oaks with this tree being the largest.



# Eastern Hemlock

- 811 W. Wooster
- Circumference – 6.5 Feet
- Height – 84 Feet
- Located in the front yard  
unusual specimen given it's  
large size. This tree grows  
best in Northeastern States  
and Canada soils. It is rare  
to have specimen the large  
in Northwest Ohio.



# Balsam Fir

- 811 W. Wooster
- Circumference – 8.2 Feet
- Height – 102 Feet
- Located in the front yard on 5 acre grounds of one of the oldest homes in the City. This is probably one of the tallest conifers.



# Cottonwood

- 707 N. Main Street
- Circumference – 22.8 Feet
- Height – 139 Feet
- Located in the front yard of this historic Queens Anne Style home. The largest trunk of any tree in the City at 22.8 feet and growing. In 1993 survey the trunk was measured at 21.7 feet.



# Tulip Poplar

- 618 W. Wooster Street
- Circumference – 11.3 Feet
- Height – 136 Feet
- Located in the front yard near the west corner of the home. Probably the largest tulip poplar in the City.
- Tulip tree is found in forested tracks. This tree was probably a volunteer seed that grew close to the house.



# Ginkgo

- 431 W. Wooster Street
- Circumference – 11 Feet
- Height – 95 Feet
- By far the largest Ginkgo in the City. This very old tree is located at the rear of this century old former oil mansion in Boon Town District of the City.



# Sycamore

- 325 S. Church Street
- Circumference – 13 Feet
- Height – 138 Feet
- Located in the rear at the corner of the home. The largest sycamore in the City. Beautiful specimen with it's huge canopy.



# Hackberry

- 203 Clay Street
- Circumference – 17.6 Feet
- Height – 143 Feet
- Located in the rear yard the current resident led effort to save this stately tree by installing cable and braces to stabilize the tree. The tree was surveyed in 1993 with a circumference of 16 feet.
- Third largest Hackberry in the State of Ohio.



# Sugar Maple

- 112 Clay Street
- Circumference – 12.6 Feet
- Height – 126 Feet
- Located in the rear corner at the home. This is probably the largest sugar maple in the City.



# Shellbark Hickory

- 522 N. Main Street
- Circumference – 10 Feet
- Height – 128 Feet
- Located in the front yard.  
The current resident lived in the home since 1967 and the tree looks the same size 40 years later.
- The tree was one of the original nine surveyed in 1993.




# Bald Cypress

- 215 Pike Street
- Circumference – 6 Feet
- Height – 76 Feet
- Located in the tree lawn of this home across from Wood County Courthouse.
- Unusual tree species. The tree was on the original survey in 1993.



# White Willow

- 510 Hillcrest Drive
- Circumference – 23 Feet
- Height – 96 Feet
- Located in the rear yard.  
The current resident nominated the tree through the Ohio DNR Big Tree Registry and was determined to be the largest white willow in the state.

# Black Gum

- 1070 Melrose Court
- Circumference – 6.6 Feet
- Height – 84 Feet
- Located north of the home in the side yard. This tree towers over a grove of smaller black gum saplings.
- The tree is 84 feet tall and near the state record for this species.
- The tree will be nominated to the Ohio DNR Big Tree Registry in July 2006.



# Mulberry

- 1226 Conneaut Avenue
- Circumference – 13.3 Feet
- Height – 60 Feet
- Located in the front yard of the old Bellville Farm.
- Bellville Subdivision was built on the farm.



# Siberian Elm

- 653 Conneaut Avenue
- Circumference – 13.9 Feet
- Height – 84 Feet
- Located in the front yard this tree towers over the surrounding homes.
