AUTHORIZING THE UTILITIES DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT(S) FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE MULTITECH TREATMENT SYSTEM AND TO UPGRADE THE LIME SOFTENING TRANSFER PUMPS AT THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

WHEREAS, the City operates a Water Treatment Plant for the benefit of its residents and customers; and

WHEREAS, the existing Multitech Treatment System is no longer a viable treatment option due to the Corrosion Control Optimization water quality parameters imposed by the Ohio EPA on the Water Treatment Plant in 2016 and it is recommended to remove and sell the Multitech system to another water supplier; and

WHEREAS, the lost plant capacity from the removal of the Multitech system can be replaced by upgrading the pumping capacity of the two lime softening transfer pumps; now therefore
