**RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING THE OHIO GOVERNOR AND MEMBERS OF THE OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO RESTORE THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND TO PRE-RECESSION LEVELS**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Fund was reduced in 2011 by 50% during the Kasich Administration; and

WHEREAS, past Ohio General Assemblies have repeatedly decreased funding and revenue sharing in recent years in addition to significantly reducing the Local Government Fund, including eliminating the Estate Tax and phasing out the Tangible Personal Property Tax; and

WHEREAS, this revenue loss has made it increasingly difficult to provide basic services, rebuild infrastructure, and bolster public safety services; and

WHEREAS, when municipalities experience success in fostering safe communities, building sound infrastructure, and increasing economic development, the State of Ohio reaps the benefits as well.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Bowling Green, Ohio that:

SECTION 1: The Ohio General Assembly should restore the Local Government Fund to pre-recession levels, ensuring that these local communities are able to provide crucial services and improvements in infrastructure and public safety.

SECTION 2: This Council does hereby declare its opposition any further cuts to the Local Government Fund or the future diversion of revenues from the Local Government Fund.

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

## RESOLUTION OPPOSING HOUSE BILL 6

WHEREAS, the City of Bowling Green has partnered with other municipal electric systems to invest in traditional and renewable energy projects in Ohio and the region to supply our customers with cost-effective, reliable power;

WHEREAS, legislation – House Bill 6 (HB 6) – was recently passed by the Ohio House of Representatives, which would effectively replace the Ohio Renewable Portfolio Standard that incentivizes all renewable energy generation with the new “Ohio Clean Air Program” to provide subsidies to certain electric generating facilities;

WHEREAS, HB 6 fails to recognize municipal electric communities for their significant investments in zero-emission and low-emission energy projects;

WHEREAS, HB 6 specifically excludes generating assets owned by, or providing power to, municipal electric systems from being eligible to apply for funds through the Ohio Clean Air Program;

WHEREAS, HB 6 impacts the wholesale energy and capacity markets in PJM by subsidizing a limited set of generating assets with out of market payments;

WHEREAS, changes to the renewable portfolio standard included in HB 6 will devalue renewable energy credits produced by renewable energy projects, including zero-carbon emission projects;

WHEREAS, the City of Bowling Green residents and all customers of the Bowling Green Electric System will be financially impacted by this legislation due to the devaluing of renewable energy credits;

WHEREAS, the Ohio Municipal Electric Association and American Municipal Power, Inc., of which this community is a member of both, proposed amendments that would reduce the overall impact of the legislation on our community and customers; and

WHEREAS, those proposed amendments were not included in HB 6.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED, that the City of Bowling Green opposes Ohio House Bill 6 and any legislation that would unduly discriminate against zero-carbon emission, reduced-carbon emission and renewable generation resources owned by or serving municipal electric customers by subsidizing similarly-situated generation resources;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Bowling Green opposes Ohio House Bill 6 and any legislation that would devalue the Ohio Renewable Portfolio Standard that incents the continuation of operation as well as the development of new renewable and zero-carbon emissions generation resources in Ohio;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Bowling Green urges our State Senator Theresa Gavarone and State Representative Haraz Ghanbari to oppose this legislation unless changes are made to mitigate the impact of the legislation on our community and our customers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to our State Representative, State Senator, and Governor Mike DeWine.
